Prospect Development Internship

Date of Internship: Internships generally run a semester in length, but we can extend them depending on intern preferences. Start and end dates are flexible.

Overview: Our Prospect Development Intern will gain professional experience in multiple areas of fundraising. They will have the opportunity to improve their skills in both grant research and proposal composition. They will also have the chance to compile program and initiative data information, and develop strategies on how to effectively utilize the information in the solicitation of potential donors. Finally, the Prospect Development intern will get to exercise their creativity by researching crowdfunding platforms, fundraising event planning, and assisting with campaign development. This internship is a great opportunity to increase experience and improve an array of skills!

Responsibilities:

- Research prospective donors to support our organization's programs;
- Identify philanthropic indicators of prospective donors;
- Create donor profiles;
- Work with our team to develop contribution request strategies;
- Research and outreach for in-kind donors or multiple fundraising events;
- Grant research, some grant request writing possible (depending on experience);
- Assist in the expansion of our Team Transplant by identifying team captains across the country;
- Customizing proposals based on specific donor guidelines;
- Compiling and formatting all necessary documents for large grant proposals if necessary;
- Researching funding sources using databases and the Internet.

Personal Qualifications:

- Applicant must have clear and professional verbal and writing skills;
- Completed or working toward a college degree with an interest in non-profit or social work;
- Poised, pleasant and helpful demeanor;
- Self-motivated, good organizational and interpersonal skills, detail-oriented and the ability to multitask, prioritize, and meet deadlines;
- Passion and enthusiasm for the mission of the American Transplant Foundation;
- Respectful with an understanding of working with confidential information.

Required Qualifications:

- Volunteer or employment experience at a nonprofit organization with an understanding for how nonprofits function;
- Desire to learn the ins-and-outs of fund development, along with a willingness to complete a range of tasks;
- Good organizational skills, an eye for detail and capacity to improve systems for greater efficiency;
- Analytically minded with an affinity for research and writing;
- Equally comfortable working with a team or working on your own with minimal supervision;
- Ability to maintain a consistent schedule throughout the internship.

Status: This is a part-time, 6-24 hour/week internship, and it is preferred that the intern works in the office a minimum of twice per week.
